All schools across England sit tests at the age of 11- these are called Key Stage 2 SATs.

The tests help schools to group children ready for secondary school and also gives parents an indication of how their child has performed compared to any other 11 year old and how their primary school compares to other schools in England.

Great news- Valour schools have achieved amazing results, both in Beech Hill and Walbottle Village primary schools.

Nationally across England the percentage of children reaching age expectation in the tests 2023 were as follows;

Reading 73%
Writing 71%
Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling 72%
Maths 73%
Children passing all tests 59%

Results in Valour schools

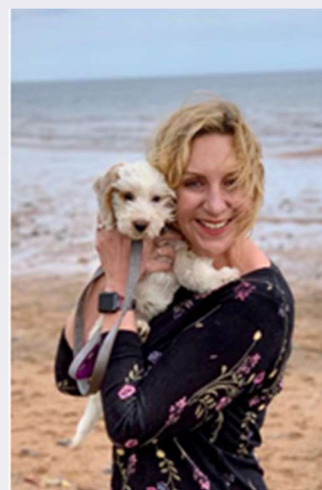
